

NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY FOR A PUBLIC HEARING REGARDING A FLOODPLAIN ENCROACHMENT
RESULTING FROM PROPOSED IMPROVEMENT OF THE NUECES COUNTY AIRPORT IN ROBSTOWN, TEXAS

The Nueces County Airport in Robstown Texas proposes to construct a new refueling location on the existing airport apron (Proposed Action). The new fueling station will include two 12,000 aboveground double walled UL-2085 tanks, with over-wing self-serve dispensing skid placed at the designated refueling location on the existing apron. One tank will be used for AVGAS and the other will be used for JET-A fuel. The Proposed Action includes a concrete foundation and secondary containment structure. All piping would be above ground level. The purpose of the improvement is to meet the need for additional fueling capacity at the airport. The proposed improvement has been designed to minimize adverse impacts to the floodplain, and will not result in a considerable probability of loss of life; will not result in future damage associated with the encroachment that could be substantial in cost or extent, including interruption of service on or loss of a vital transportation facility; and will not result in a notable adverse impact on natural and beneficial floodplain values. The airport is providing the public an opportunity to request a public hearing regarding the floodplain encroachment.
