Outdated Ordinances

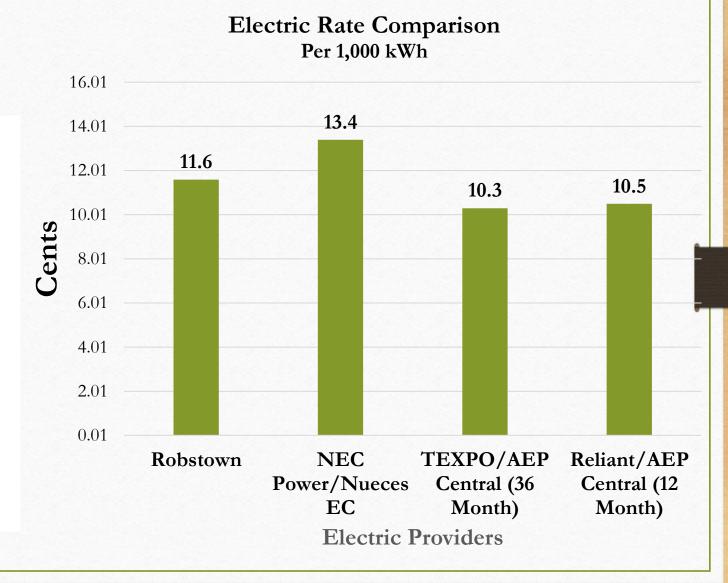
- City Secretary's office is working with the all the departments on updating ordinances.

OPERATION CRACKDOWN

OBJECTIVE OF OPERATION:

Assist communities to knock down properties that are proven drug/crime nexus locations.

PROCESS

- Structures are identified (police, border patrol, building dept. code enforcement, citizens)
- Certification of crime activity by Police and Building Department.
- Property owners are notified for voluntary consent for participation in the program
- Environmental clearance (SHPO)
- City council approval
- Demolition

COST

- NO cost to the owners
- City must pay for asbestos testing and abatement, haul-off and landfill costs
- Cost in 2017 \$375,000 for 40 structures
- Cost in 2018 \$281,250 for 30 structures
- The city must commit to at least 25 homes for a mission to be considered.

PUBLIC WORKS

Boys & Girls Club Building

- Building in need of repairs, AC units in Gym and building will need replacing.
- Roof on Gym and building will need patching and minor repairs.
- Currently getting quotes for the repairs of the buildings.

- One of the major factors that caused the Boys & Girls Club to shut down in Robstown was that it was not generating revenue due to the competition with the 21st Century.
- We are currently looking into the Texas Park and Wildlife grant specifications for the usage of the building.

Brush

- City is divided into 6 zones
- Operation is done by 2006 and 2009 self-loading brush trucks.
- Council approved the purchase a 2021 self-loading brush truck

Street Maintenance

- 5 employees that divide into 2 patching crews
- 80% proactively and 20% reactively.

Street Repairs

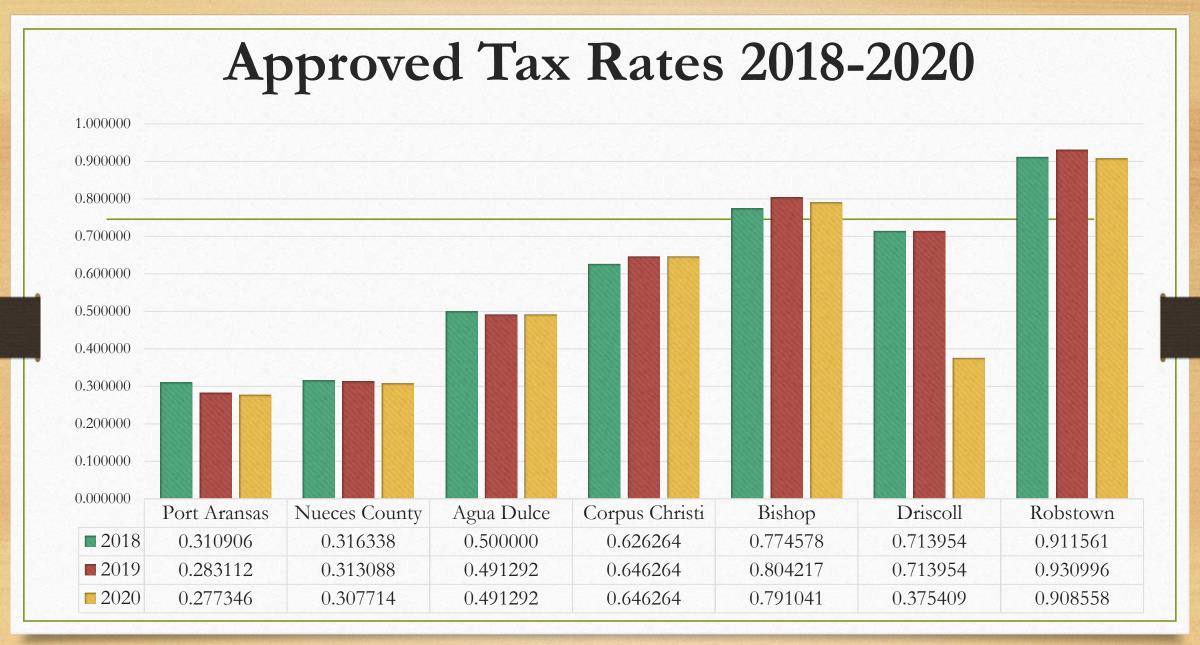
- 7th Street Improvements consist of sub surface drainage, curb and gutter, subgrade treatment, base reconstruction and paving.
 - Seal bids were overbudget
 - Council approved for Public works to construct the project in house for \$120,000.
 - Current status: 66% of the curb and gutter has been completed.

• City has allocated \$125,000 for street improvements.

Robstown Tax Rate 2015 - 2020



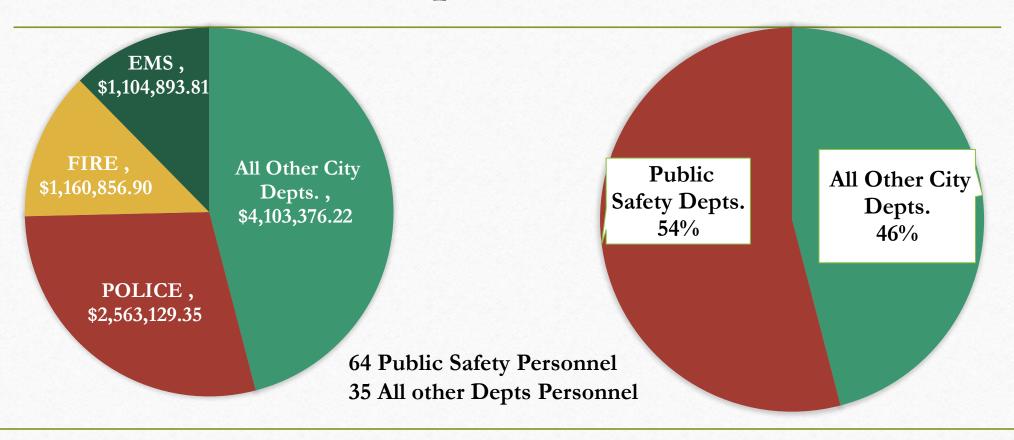

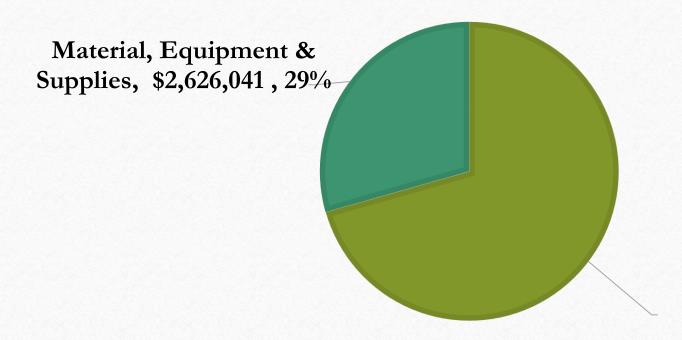
