DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT
FOR THE
PROPOSED 60-FT ACCESS EASEMENT AND CONSTRUCTION OF A ROADWAY AND
RELATED INFRASTRUCTURE AT TX160, ROBSTOWN, NUECES COUNTY, TEXAS

The United States Army Reserve (USAR), 63d Readiness Division (63d RD), Directorate of Public Works (DPW), Environmental Division announces the availability of a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) and Draft Finding of No Significant Impact (FNSI) for public review and comment. The Draft EA and Draft FNSI evaluate the potential environmental effects associated with constructing a roadway and related infrastructure within a 60-foot easement for access into the City of Robstown's Public Works Compound utilizing a 0.9790-acre tract of land, which is within the 50.283-acre federally owned parcel. Current access to the compound is located on State Department Road. Due to the vicinity of the road in relation to the Union Pacific Railway, State Department Road is being shut down. Therefore, personnel will no longer have access to the facilities utilizing the current roadway. The proposed roadway will connect the City's Public Works Compound to USAR entry road that connects to US Highway 77 and State Highway 44 and will provide municipal access to the compound for city personnel.

The 63d RD prepared the Draft EA and Draft FNSI in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and regulations implementing the Act. The 63d RD intends to issue a Final EA and Final FNSI following this 30-day comment period. Comments on the Draft EA and Draft FNSI will be summarized and addressed in the Final EA and Final FNSI.
